### **Skyestone Work Group**

Warm Hearts Warm Babies is a nonprofit that began in 2000 to provide basic items for premature infants and newborns. We deliver handmade totes to more than 65 Colorado agencies including hospitals, clinics, shelters, Ronald McDonald houses, law enforcement agencies, and pregnancy crisis centers. 100% of donations we receive go to help the babies. We recently donated 26 quilts to Bayfield. One quilt went to a pregnant young woman who is living in a tent. The need for basic items for our youngest citizens is great.

Our Skyestone group was established in 2015 with 3 volunteers. We now have approximately 70 members who create handmade items such as blankets, quilts, bibs, burp cloths, sleepers, gowns, and other essentials for babies.

We meet at 10:00 am the first Tuesday of the month in the Lodge. During the meetings volunteers stuff toy animals, sew quilts, and cut out bibs and burp cloths. Many volunteers work at home during the month to finish needed items. Anne Connelly, Skyestone Work Group Leader
