KING SOOPERS REWARD PROGRAM FOR WARM HEARTS WARM BABIES

How Can I PERSONALLY give money to WHWB?

I have asked that question at some time or another.

The answer is... Purchase a King Soopers re-loadable gift card from your local WHWB Representative for \$2.50.

That sounds strange, how can that provide money from me to Warm Hearts?

Please Read ALL the points following and then ask, if you have more questions:

- When you use your card at King Soopers or its affiliates, 5% of your purchase will accumulate and WHWB will receive a check every month.
- How do I do this? Before you go shopping for gas or groceries, go to the Customer Service desk of any King Soopers, and have them load any dollar amount up to \$500.00 on the gift card that you just bought from your Rep.
- When you check out... BEFORE THE CASHIER STARTS SCANNING YOUR ITEMS. Either ask him/her to load money on the card or just present your Rewards Card as payment. The cost of your purchase will be deducted from your card's balance.
- If Your Card's Value Is Depleted... Do Not Throw The Card Away... Reload It With More Money. Please do not let your card go to zero, it will expire in 90 days.
- The following purchases are NOT included in this program: money orders, stamps, lottery tickets, or other gift cards.
- If your card is lost or stolen King Soopers will not be responsible
- Reward cards must be purchased through WHWB and NOT directly from the store.
- To find the balance of your card you may ask a Cashier or call
866-822-6252
- Gas credits are still valid using this Gift Card.
- A Rewards card can be purchased and loaded with money as a gift but please remind that person not to throw it away but to reload it, continue to use it and provide a benefit to WHWB.
- If you do not shop King Soopers there are other locations where you can use the card: Any Kroger owned affiliate, City Market, Loaf & Jug, Smith's Food, Food 4 Less, & Fred Meyer Jewelry. Also can be used at affiliates out of state.

CROCHETTED BABY BURIAL BUNTING

SUPPLIES: 1 yarn of ¼” ribbon ~~~ Size H crochet Hook ~~~ Large, Blunt – tipped darning needle. **BABY YARN – SOFT, PASTEL COLORS ARE PERFECT**

DIRECTIONS:

Row 1: Ch 31, turn , reverse direction

Row 2: Start in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each st, at end of row Ch 2, turn.

Row 3: Starting in 4th st from hook, dc in each st, at end of row, ch 2, turn, (forms ribbon casing)

Row 4 - 15: Start in 3rd st from hook, hdc in each st., ch 2 at end of each row, turn repeat, at end of row 15, Ch 3, turn,

Row 16: Start in 4th st. from hook, dc in each st. do not chain at end, turn (form neck ribbon casing)

Row 17: Start in st next to hook, sl st in first 5 st, then hdc remainder of row leaving the last 5 st unworked, ch 2, turn (form first row of hood),

Row 18 – 24: Start at 3rd st from hook, hdc in each st, ch 2 at end of each row, turn & repeat (forms hood)

Row 25: Fold bunting in half length-wise, lining up the stitches at front center of hood, then sl st top of hood closed from front to back. Tie off. Weave in ends.

FINISH: Cut ¼” ribbon in 2 pieces 18 inches long each. Using a large blunt needle, weave the first piece of ribbon into the neck casing,. Lap the right bottom side over the left by 4-5 stitches and secure by weaving the second piece of ribbon through bottom casing. Snip ribbon ends at angle, tie in bows. Snuggly gather the bottom casing, loosely gather the neck casing.

NOTE; Size can be varied by changing the needle size and yarn size. Make a flannel liner.

## KNITTED BABY BUNTING

**Supplies:** 1 yarn of ¼” ribbon ~Size 8 knitting needles~Large, Blunt – tipped darning needle

### **DIRECTIONS:**

Cast on 34 (44) stitches

#### **Bunting Body:**

Rows 1 & 2 rows: Knit across

Row 3: K1, \*K2 tog, YO, Repeat from \* to the last stitch, K1

Row 4: K across. Work garter stitch until piece measures 5” (7”) from cast on edge

Repeat Rows 3 & 4, once. Bind off all stitches.

### **FINISHING**

Line with flannel , Fold the top of the hood in half and weave the seam closed

Cut the ribbon in half (2 18” pieces) and weave the first piece of ribbon into the neck casing.

Lap the right bottom side over the left by 4-5 stitches and secure by weaving the second piece of the ribbon through the bottom casing. Snip ribbon ends at an angle, tie in bows.

Snuggly gather the bottom casing, loosely gather the neck casings.

The buntings look best if lined with a flannel liner.
